



Happy National Arts in Education Week!

We are so glad that you are interested in joining Americans for the Arts' celebration of National Arts in Education Week!

Designated by Congress in 2010, <u>House Resolution 275</u> designates the week beginning with the second Sunday in September as National Arts in Education Week. During this week, the field of arts education joins together in communities across the country to tell the story of the impact of the transformative power of the arts in education. We hope that you can participate:

- Celebrate. Host a celebration in your community, whether big or small, an existing event, or a new one. Download and use the <u>shared logo</u> and be sure to register your event on <u>ArtsMeet</u>, a national arts event calendar.
- 2. Advocate. Work with your elected officials and decision-makers to share the value of the arts in education. Whether a mayor, principal, or U.S. Congressman, check out <u>sample resolutions</u> and <u>videos</u>, send an <u>op-ed to your local newspaper</u>, and use the <u>Arts Education Navigator</u>—an online tool with six action steps to crafting a personal advocacy plan. Be sure to <u>sign the petition</u> encouraging Secretary of Education, Betsy DeVos to support the arts!
- 3. **Participate**. Share your story in the social media campaign, <u>#BecauseOfArtsEd</u>, to bring national visibility to the issue of arts education. See below for more information and download the <u>How To Guide</u>. Also, be sure to attend and invite friends to the <u>Facebook Event</u>.
