Many of the approximately 60 paintings, works on paper, and photographs from iconic artists such as Berenice Abbott and Louis Lozowick, celebrate modernism in American perspectives and artistic styles through depictions of growing industry, Streamline Moderne architecture, and the modern machine aesthetic, which evolved in response to the blossoming of urban industrial centers across the country during the early 1900s. The exhibition holds particular relevance to audiences in Tulsa, a "boomtown" and former oil capital of the world. The project will include a variety of public programs developed in collaboration with community partners.
